Dear Friends:

We are writing to you because of your continued interest in human rights issues in the U.S. The Special International Tribunal on Political Prisoners and POWs in the U.S. is producing two ten-part profiles on political prisoners and prisoners of war for radio to be ready for distribution by the first week of November.

These profiles will be between 8-10 minutes long and will feature interviews with activists/prisoners from the Native American, Black/New Afrikan, North American, and Puerto Rican movements.

The Tribunal, which will take place on December 7-10, 1990 at Hunter College in New York City, will pass judgment on evidence presented to them on violations of the human rights of U.S. political prisoners. The Tribunal will be attended by national and international observers from human rights organizations.

We are asking progressive activist/media workers to help us disseminate information about the Tribunal, and towards this end, will contact you in the near future to discuss the possibilities of distributing the series.
