This month marks one year of military dictatorship in Chile--one year in which the Chilean people have been the target of the most brutal repression in recent Latin American history. Since the September 11th coup all democratic freedoms have been abolished and the Junta has moved with ^{force-} ~~the~~ full determination to erase a culture and a way of life that had its highest expression in the people's struggle for socialism. The Nazi-led repressive apparatus has been responsible for the killing of over 30,000 people and ^{the} ~~has~~ imprisonment in concentration camps of nearly twice that many. Inflation reached 1200% while over 200,000 have been forced into unemployment. In their desperate attempts to preserve control over our country, the military are trying to eliminate a consciousness shared by millions of Chileans.

The military carry out their acts of terror as the direct servants of the Chilean bourgeoisie and the US imperialists. The same corporations that moved in hasty desperation to overthrow the Popular Unity government are now recuperating their losses by way of the super exploitation of thousands of Chilean workers. It has been almost one year since Marilyn Buck, a ^{white woman} political activist known to many people in the Bay Area, was sentenced to ten years in prison for allegedly purchasing ammunition under a false name. During her trial her name was repeatedly linked with the Black Liberation Army. ^{Throughout her trial} Marilyn refused to disassociate herself from the goals of the Black Liberation struggle. She refused to ~~hide her strength~~ and determination from ~~the~~ U.S. District Court Judge Samuel Conti who described her in familiar anti-woman terms as "clever, intelligent and dangerous." Conti said he was jailing Marilyn Buck to "save someone from being killed." ~~The jury that convicted Marilyn did not understand that the penalty could be so severe.~~ Ordinarily the penalty is light for an infraction of this kind. The jury that convicted Marilyn ~~did not understand that the sentence could be so severe.~~ ^{was not informed} ~~stand that the sentence could be so severe.~~ ^{Both the} jury panel and Marilyn's friends were shocked at ^{the} Judge Conti's ^{cruelty}. ^{of Conti's 10 yr. sentence.} Before being taken from the courtroom, Marilyn made this ^{righteous} statement to the Judge:

"The oppressed people of this country and the world will have freedom at any cost and by any means necessary. The "law and order" regime of this international gang of thieves and murderers does not uphold justice and freedom for humanity. These dogs care only for money and power which is based on the death and destruction of the masses. They are sabotaging, conspiring against and murdering those who believe in and fight for freedom. Tell me, who are then the ~~victims~~ criminals and who are the victims? I am one of these rabid dogs' victims. The illegal means they have used to persecute and incarcerate me are the real crimes. Crimes against me because of my political beliefs and my concern for society. This court has been a travesty on law and justice. The day is coming when your imperialist racist gang will have to face the law of freedom and humanity. No matter how many political prisoners you take, your lock up will not turn back or stop time for you. And in the end, we will win! "

Today, after 18 months in various prisons around the country since her arrest, Marilyn has lost none of her courage ~~and~~ or fighting spirit. In a recent interview in Cook County Jail in Chicago she said " It would be a real victory for the people who run this jail to see me crumble. That's what they want to see, and I'm determined not to give them the satisfaction."

The fact that Marilyn Buck is in Cook County Jail although she is a Federal prisoner is typical of the ^{cruel + unusual} treatment she has recieved from the police, the courts, and now the prison system. There are only two women's federal penitentiaries in the US, at Alderston, W.V. and at Terminal Island, California. Marilyn ~~has been~~ ^{was} refused by the wardens of both women's prisons, because ^{she is} ~~she is~~ political ~~and~~ ^{believes she is} regarded as an organizer, unfit to be in population. ⁶ months ago she was transferred from Terminal Island to Cook County Jail along with four ^{TW} ~~other~~ women, ~~all Third World women~~. The warden of Cook County Jail has boasted that he runs the heaviest jail in the U.S. and he has sent out the word throughout the prison ~~system~~ ^{quote} that he will take on the "baddest" prisoners anyone wants to send him : meaning the most political. Marilyn quoted him as saying that "if he can handle Bobby Seale, he can handle anybody."

Cook County Jail has a brand new building for women. ^{It's} A fascist prison. Built under ~~the~~ liberal guise of improving conditions. ^{It has} no windows, no yard, soundproof cells, ^{and} cameras everywhere. ^{It is} surrounded by a high fence and armed guards. Marilyn said that ~~it~~ ^{CCJ} is definitely the worst prison she has been in, and that all of the women with her preferred the ~~old~~ ^{old} rat-infested, leaking, ~~rotten~~ jail, which still holds 3000 men today.)

She said that the physical conditions of a jail are not nearly so important as the way the women are treated as human beings. In Cook County Jail people are stripped of their human dignity, and regulations are never made clear so as to make the women ^{constantly} subject to being thrown into isolation arbitrarily. Marilyn herself has been in isolation on several occasions during the past 6 months.

Marilyn's case is on appeal now, but as a Federal prisoner in ~~the~~ county jail it is difficult for her to work on her case.

In Old Cook Cty. the f were in far more contact w each other and could survive together better.

During ~~the~~ an interview that lasted less ^{than} an hour, Marilyn talked repeatedly about the women in prison with her, almost all Black women, many of them waiting ^{up} to two years without bail to go to trial. Marilyn said that everyone ~~is~~ ^{women} in prison with her was a political prisoner in some way, and she asked the women's movement to support these sisters ^{and other prisoners of war} in every way they can.

Marilyn's case is on appeal now, but as a Federal prisoner in a County jail ^{it has been} ~~is~~ difficult for her to work on her case. She ^{has} ~~is~~ ^{ed} ~~is~~ recieve legal help from legal workers who are members of the Chicago Women's Union. ~~Marilyn Buck needs the~~ ~~of~~ support of people on the outside.

Like millions of other women, Marilyn ^{Buck} has refused to be what this system wants her to be. ^{Like} a growing number of white people, Marilyn Buck has supported the principle of self-determination for Black people.
