I cannot accept the Catholic Church or the "right to life" mentality as a regulating body.

"What realistically do they care about a black fetus?" she asked very evenly ~~(and bluntly)~~. "Yes, everyone has a right to life, but we (blacks) have a right to starve and the right to be spit upon, all in the name of an insane morality."

These same people," she said, "are spitting and throwing rocks at black children going to school on a bus. What they perceive now as a right to life would in six years be a right to be called names."

It is ironic that the man chosen to bear the burden of trial was one who is not making money hand over fist on abortions, as some are; one who was the first American black resident in ob. gynec. and gynecology at Boston City Hospital; one who was primarily in service to the poor.

"He made waves," ~~the~~ ~~characterizing his work~~ at HCH. "For black women, poor, Third World women. Even before he was chief resident, he was critical of hospital policy and attitudes of some of the people that worked on the wards. He let it be known that he was not satisfied with the care of his patients."

"Black people, intellectuals, women and liberals have all been victimized in this case. What has happened affects all these groups directly. I hope this country is not returning to the era where any time a white man says a black is guilty, he is, no matter how outrageous the charge may be."

"Who can be free if you can be tried and convicted of something that is not a crime?" ~~he asked in a soft but vehement voice.~~ "Legally anyone can find themselves a convicted felon at the whim of any one group."

TWO OF THE WOMEN, ELLEN GRUSSE AND TERRY TURGEON HAVE REFUSED TO TALK - BOTH TO THE FBI AGENTS WHO APPROACHED THEM FOR INFORMATION AND ~~also~~ <sup>Also</sup> THE GRAND JURY. THEY ISSUED A STATEMENT WHICH READS IN PART:

We have ~~also~~ seen how the government, acting both through the F.B.I. and grand juries, has used inquiries such as this to harrass and gather information on political leftists and feminists in recent years. Any person who talks with F.B.I. agents or to grand juries runs the risk of giving up their constitutional right to remain silent and having what they say used in some twisted way against them or their friends or *sisters in criminal charges.*

These tactics have also been used by the government to create distrust, confusion and disunity among people and break up communities of women and other political groups.

THEY CONTINUE BY SAYING.....

What makes us most angry is that we have been forced into a position of playing the Man's games, the rules of which deny us our basic rights, dignity and responsibility <sup>as well as</sup> and control over our own lives. In reality it is not very different from the every day life of every woman living with the fear of rape, brutalization by men, defining herself through her "man," etc. We feel that giving information to the F.B.I. gives in to the power that they hold over us, a power that perpetuates ~~the~~ women's position and the position of all oppressed peoples.

IN LEXINGTON, KY. FIVE WOMEN AND ONE MAN, ALL OF WHOM REFUSED TO GIVE THE FBI INFORMATION, WERE SUBPOENED TO A GRAND JURY THERE. THE FBI HAS BEEN HAUNTING THE GAY COMMUNITY IN LEXINGTON FOR INFORMATION. BECAUSE OF THIS HARRASSMENT AN INQUIRY INTO THE TACTICS <sup>of</sup> ~~of~~ THE FBI IS BEING LAUNCHED AND AGENTS ARE ACCUSED OF THE FOLLOWING:

- ¶ Harassing the young people and informing their relatives or employers of their homosexual life-styles.
- ¶ Threatening the young people with grand jury subpoenas should they refuse to cooperate in the bureau's search for the fugitives.
- ¶ Giving friends and relatives of the young people false information about them as a means of inducing the friends' and relatives' cooperation.

THIS WEEK IN PLATTSBURG NEW YORK BLACK-PUERTO RICAN REVOLUTIONARY MARTIN SOSTRE WAS FOUND GUILTY OF ASSAULT ON PRISON GUARDS. THE CHARGES CAME IN CONNECTION WITH SOSTRE'S REFUSAL TO SUBMIT TO A RECTAL SEARCH WHILE BEING HELD IN SOLITARY CONFINEMENT. THE STATE CLAIMED THAT SOSTRE STRUCK THREE OF THE SEVEN GUARDS WHO BEAT HIM. ~~WHEN HE REFUSED.~~ SOSTRE HAS BEEN IN PRISON FOR EIGHT YEARS. HE WAS ORIGINALLY FRAMED ON HEROIN CHARGES, ~~AND THE PROSECUTION HAS BEEN PROVEN~~ ~~BECAUSE~~ THE WITNESS AGAINST HIM HAS CONFESSED THAT HE LIED. NEVERTHELESS SOSTRE'S CONVICTION <sup>HAS BEEN</sup> ~~WAS~~ NOT OVERTURNED. THE REAL REASON WHY HE WAS IMPRISONED WAS HIS ORGANIZING WORK AMONG BLACK YOUTH IN BUFFALO, WHERE HE SET UP A RECORD AND BOOKSTORE ~~AND SPENT HIS MONEY~~ WITH MONEY HE HAD EARNED AS A FACTORY WORKER AND THEN DEDICATED FULL TIME TO POLITICAL EDUCATION AND ORGANIZING. HIS ORGANIZING EFFORTS, HIS <sup>dignified</sup> REFUSAL TO SUBMIT TO THE INDIGNITIES OF PRISON, <sup>and</sup> HIS WORK ON BEHALF OF OTHER PRISONERS, HAVE WON HIM THE RESPECT OF THOUSANDS OF PRISONERS. IN 1972 HE HELPED LEAD A STRIKE IN THE SLAVE LABOR LICENSE PLATE FACTORY IN AUBURN PRISON. AFTER THAT, GUARDS CAME TO HIM SAYING HE HAD TO SHAVE HIS BEARD OR BE PUT IN THE BOX. HE SAID HE HAD A CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO HAVE A BEARD AND WAS PLACED IN THE BOX WHERE HE HAS BEEN SINCE 1972. IT WAS THERE THAT MARTIN SOSTRE REFUSED TO SUBMIT TO THE RECTAL SEARCH AND WAS CHARGED WITH ASSAULT ON GUARDS. AT HIS TRIAL, THE DEFENSE HAD GREAT DIFFICULTY INTRODUCING ANY EVIDENCE OR BACKGROUND NOT RELATING TO THE SPECIFIC INCIDENT. HE WAS DEFENDED BY ATTORNIES LIZ FINK AND DENNIS CUNNINGHAM. WHEN THE GUILTY VERDICT WAS BROUGHT BACK, ~~IN~~ THE COURTROOM, FILLED WITH SUPPORTERS, ERUPTED IN ANGER AND PROTEST. <sup>ATTORNEY</sup> DENNIS CUNNINGHAM SPOKE TO KATHIE STREEM ABOUT THE SCENE:

IN WEST GERMANY TWO PRISONERS, MEMBERS OF THE RED ARMY FACTION, HAVE BEEN RELEASED BY THE GOVERNMENT IN PARTIAL COMPLIANCE WITH THE DEMANDS OF THE JUNE 2nd MOVEMENT. <sup>The movement</sup> WHICH HAS CLAIMED RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE KIDNAPPING OF WEST BERLIN POLITICIAN PETER LAWRENCE, CONSERVATIVE LAW AND ORDER CANDIDATE FOR MAYOR IN SUNDAY'S ELECTION. THE JUNE 2nd MOVEMENT DEMANDED THE RELEASE OF 6 MEMBERS OF THE RED ARMY FACTION, SAYING THAT THE POLITICIAN WILL BE KILLED UNLESS THE DEMAND IS MET. TWO <sup>members</sup> HAVE BEEN RELEASED AS A CONCESSION. THE SITUATION IS DEVELOPING. AND ANTI WAR THE RED ARMY FACTION IS A GROUP THAT GREW OUT OF THE STUDENT/MOVEMENT <sup>in</sup> WEST GERMANY DURING THE SIXTIES. <sup>The organization</sup> WHICH ENGAGED IN ARMED ACTIONS, INCLUDING THE BLOWING UP OF THE US ARMY COMPUTER CENTER IN HEIDELBERG THAT PLANNED THE MINING OF HAIPHONG HARBOR IN VIETNAM. MANY ALLEGED MEMBERS OF THE RED ARMY FACTION HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN THE PAST SEVERAL YEARS. LEADERS INCLUDE ULRIKA MEINHOF, ~~ISS~~ ANDREAS BAADER, AND HORST MAHLER. MAHLER'S RELEASE WAS DEMANDED BY THE JUNE 2nd movement, BUT NOT MEINHOF AND BAADER, WHO ARE SCHEDULED FOR TRIAL IN MAY. MANY OF THE PRISONERS HAVE BEEN ON HUNGER STRIKES IN PROTEST OF PRISON CONDITIONS. THE JUNE 2nd MOVEMENT DERIVES ITS NAME FROM JUNE 2nd 1967, WHEN A WEST GERMAN STUDENT WAS KILLED <sup>during a</sup> ~~IN~~ DEMONSTRATION <sup>protesting</sup> ~~AGAINST~~ A VISIT BY THE SHAH OF IRAN.....
