JUNETEENTH is celebrated in Black communities throughout the U.S.. in remembrance of the day June 19, 1863, that Black people in Texas received word of the "Emancipation" Proclamation. It is also a day to continue struggling for REAL freedom and justice: jobs for all, schools, housing, healthcare, and an end to racism and discrimination.

ON THIS JUNETEENTH, the police massacre in Philadelphia is a reminder that the struggle against racism and repression in the U.S. is far from over. Eleven Black people were murdered and 250 Black residents lost everything in this Nazi-like police holocaust.

AS WE MARCH in the Juneteenth parade, the people of South Africa will also be commemorating the heroic Soweto uprising of Black youth on June 16, 1976. The Soweto rebellion has become an international symbol of the courage and determination of Black South Africans in their struggle for liberation.
