During the first few days of December there were 11 bombings in Puerto Rico. 8 of the bombs exploded during a 3 hr. pre-dawn period.

2. U.S. Army reserve bldgs. & vehicles
3. Commonwealth oil refinery
4. Union Carbide Plant
5. Burger King Restaurant

The national guard had all ready been called out because of the water & sewer authority strike & some of the bombings & of water mains & lines that resulted from the strike. ~~With~~ ~~the~~ additional national guard were called out after the recent bombings <sup>in order</sup> to protect U. S. business interests.

The most humble proletarian woman's husband <sup>who</sup> has been fired from his job or is being persecuted, and she must wage a daily struggle for the survival of her family..."

# Non-Intervention In Chile

*Following the U.N. resolution & Mrs. Allende's statement.*  
We want to bring your attention to the fact that Chile's, United Democratic Anti-Fascist Resistance ~~from its headquarters in Rome,~~ has called for an international campaign to obtain the release of all women political prisoners in Chile by Christmas Day 1974.

*N*  
The coup and its repressive aftermath have wreaked havoc with normal family life in many of the poor families in Chile. The imprisonment of thousands of women adds greatly to the hardships of families already burdened by grave economic difficulties and ~~other dislocations~~ *disruptions & dislocations of children's lives,* resulting from the imprisonment, disappearance or firing from employment of other family members. There may be as many as 20,000 children thus effectively orphaned on the streets of Santiago. Besides the generally bad prison conditions and constant threat of torture or assassination they share with imprisoned men, women prisoners are especially vulnerable to rape and forms of physical and mental sexist abuse.

Prominent among the women currently in the hands of the military is Laura Allende, former Congresswoman and sister of the late President of Chile, who was arrested on November 5, 1974. *She was* ~~the pretext of~~ *arrested on* ~~the pretext of~~ *accused of* possessing four hand grenades and subversive literature. The absurdity of these charges is made clear by the fact that she has been under house arrest and constant intelligence surveillance since the coup on September 11, 1973. In addition, she is 56 years old and suffering from cancer. Laura had courageously chosen to remain in Chile rather than seek asylum abroad.

THE STATE OF GUERRERO, IN ~~THE~~ SOUTHWEST ~~OF~~ MEXICO IS THE POOREST  
REGION IN THE ENTIRE COUNTRY. OF ITS POPULATION OF NEARLY TWO  
MILLION PEOPLE, 48% OVER THE AGE OF TEN ARE ILLITERATE, ONE THIRD  
OF THE WORKING POPULATION WORKS FOR FIFTY CENTS A DAY, 61% OF THE  
HOUSES IN GUERRERO ARE ONE ROOM DWELLINGS. THIS AREA IS THE CENTER  
OF THE PRODUCTION OF COFFEE, CACAO AND COPRA, ~~WHICH GIVES COCONUT OIL.~~  
THE COLGATE PALMOLIVE COMPANY AND NESTLES CHOCOLATE COMPANY BOTH  
HAVE LARGE <sup>imperialist</sup> LANDHOLDINGS IN GUERRERO.

CABANAS CAME FROM A POOR FAMILY IN GUERRERO. HE BECAME A TEACHER IN HIS EARLY TWENTIES AND WORKED TOGETHER WITH OTHER TEACHERS TO ORGANIZE THE PEOPLE OF GUERRERO. <sup>Much of</sup> THE ORGANIZATION AND MILITANCY OF THE PEOPLE CAN BE ATTRIBUTED TO THE WORK OF THESE TEACHERS. IN MAY OF 1967, DURING A SCHOOL MEETING, THERE WAS A CONFRONTATION WITH THE MILITARY AND CABANAS WAS FORCED TO FLEE. HE WENT TO THE MOUNTAINS AND JOINED FORCES WITH A MOVEMENT HEADED BY GENARO VASQUEZ. WHILE IN THE MOUNTAINS, CABANAS ORGANIZED THE EMILIANO ZAPATA LIBERATION FRONT, WHICH LATER LED TO THE FORMATION OF THE POOR PEOPLES PARTY. THE POOR PEOPLES PARTY CALLS FOR - THE EXPROPRIATION OF THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION, ECONOMIC AND POLITICAL INDEPENDENCE FOR MEXICO, EQUALITY FOR THE INDIANS OF MEXICO, AND AN END TO ILLITERACY.

~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ THE POOR PEOPLES PARTY INCLUDES NOT ONLY AN ARMED GUERRILLA <sup>ORGANIZATION</sup> GROUP, BUT ALSO PEASANT, STUDENT AND WORKERS ORGANIZATIONS.

CABANAS CONTINUED HIS GUERILLA WORK THROUGH THE ARMED BRANCH OF THE POOR PEOPLES PARTY, THE PEASANT JUSTICE BRIGADE. HE ASSUMED LEADERSHIP OF THE BRIGADE FORCES IN FEB. OF 1972. SINCE THAT TIME THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF BATTLES BETWEEN GUERILLA FORCES AND THE MILITARY. IN ADDITION TO THESE BATTLES, THE PEASANT JUSTICE BRIGADE HAS CARRIED OUT OVER 30 POLITICAL KIDNAPPINGS, INCLUDING THAT OF MEXICO'S SENATOR BUBEN FIGEROA IN MAY OF THIS YEAR. FOLLOWING THIS KIDNAPPING A STATE OF SEIGE WAS DECLARED IN THE STATE OF GUERRERO AND A FORCE OF 20,000 <sup>government</sup> TROOPS WAS SENT INTO THE AREA. REPRESSION FOLLOWED, INCLUDING MASS ARRESTS AND TORTURE. DURING A SERIES OF ARRESTS IN ACAPULO, IN THE STATE OF GUERRERO, ONE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE PEASANTS JUSTICE BRIGADE WAS CAPTURED.

THIS MAN WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR DISCLOSING THE WHEREABOUTS OF CABANAS, RESULTING IN HIS CAPTURE. NO PRESS WAS ALLOWED TO VIEW THE BODY OF CABANAS AND THE ONLY POSITIVE IDENTIFICATION WAS MADE BY PHOTOGRAPHS SHOWN TO MEMBERS OF HIS FAMILY.

~~XXXXXXX~~ THE STATE OF GUERRERO HAS HISTORICALLY BEEN THE A CENTER OF GUERILLA ACTIVITIES IN MEXICO, BEGINNING WITH THE MOVEMENT BY MORELOS IN THE MID EIGHTEEN HUNDREDS, AND INCLUDING THE GUERILLA WAR HEADED BY EMILIANO ZAPATA DURING THE MEXICAN REVOLUTION OF 1910. IN 1917, ONE OF THE GUERILLA LEADERS IN GUERRERO WAS BABLO CABANAS, LUCIO CABANAS'S GRANDFATHER.

CABANAS FOLLOWED IN THE <sup>Proud Fighting Tradition of his state. responsible, but it goes a lot further than him. As the Chicago Lawyer's Guild paper commented, "A thorough investigation of federal involvement is in order. Such an investigation may well lead right to John Mitchell, the Plumbers, and Richard M Nixon. For, in such events as the murder of Fred Hampton, lies the true meaning of Watergate."

III

One of the measures of the leadership of Fred Hampton and the continuing meaning of his life is found in the community response to his murder. He was known by many people in the Chicago community, active from a very early age. Five thousand people attended the funeral of Fred Hampton and Mark Clark, vowing to avenge their deaths. There are many stories that could be told about Fred, his courage in the face of repression. One of the jobs he held was as a maintenance man at International Harvester in Melrose Park. ~~the~~ year after he died, the workers at the plant organized to demand a ten minute work break in his honor on his birthday, August 28th. Hundreds of workers of all races wore buttons ~~for days before~~ <sup>the work break</sup> with his picture and the words, "The spirit of Fred lives. I am a Revolutionary." Although the company denied permission for the ~~memorial~~, brief meetings were held anyway. ~~International Harvester was only the place that had been~~ <sup>Many people were deeply,</sup> touched by the spirit of Fred Hampton.....a devotion to the people, a striving for unity, an unwavering call for Revolution. As he said, "You can jail a revolutionary, but you can't jail the Revolution. You can run a freedom fighter around the country, but you can't run freedom fighting around the country.
